

Standardised Price List – Honley

All funeral directors are legally required to publish this Price List for a standardised set of products and services. This is to help you think through your options and make choices, and to let you compare prices between different funeral directors *(because prices can vary)*.

Attended Funeral (funeral director’s charges only)

This is a funeral where family and friends have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person at the same time as they attend their burial or cremation.

Taking care of all necessary legal and administrative arrangements	£980
Collecting and transporting the deceased person from the place of death (normally within 15 miles of the funeral director’s premises) into the funeral director’s care	£160
Care of the deceased person before the funeral in appropriate facilities. The deceased person will be kept at the funeral director’s branch premises.	£350
Provide a suitable coffin – this will be made from oak veneer	£395
Viewing of the deceased person for family and friends, by appointment with the funeral director (where viewing is requested by the customer).	£35
At a date and time you agree with the funeral director, taking the deceased person direct to the agreed cemetery or crematorium (normally within 20 miles of the funeral director’s premises) in a hearse or other appropriate vehicle	£345

Unattended Funeral

This is a funeral where family and friends may choose to have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person, but they do not attend the burial or cremation itself.

Burial (funeral director’s charges only)	£1315
Cremation (funeral director’s charges plus the cremation fee)	£1970

Fees You Must Pay

For an Attended or Unattended burial funeral, the burial fee ¹	£982

In this local area, the typical cost of the burial fee for local residents is:
For a new grave, you will also need to pay for the plot; for an existing grave with a memorial in place, you may need to pay a removal/replacement fee. In addition, the cemetery may charge a number of other fees.

For an Attended cremation funeral, the cremation fee ²	£655–£742
In this local area, the typical cost of a cremation for local residents is:	£742

Additional Funeral Director Products and Services

This funeral director may be able to supply a range of optional, additional products and services, or to arrange (on your behalf) for a third party to supply them. Examples include:

Additional mileage (price per mile)	£1
Additional transfers of the deceased person’s body (e.g. to their home, to a place of worship etc.) (price per transfer)	£150
Collection and delivery of ashes	£1
Embalming	£90
Funeral officiant (e.g. celebrant, minister of religion etc.)	Price on request
Services supplied outside of normal office hours	Price on request

¹ This fee (which is sometimes called the interment fee) is the charge made for digging and closing a new grave, or for reopening and closing an existing grave.

² In England, Wales and Northern Ireland, you will usually need to pay doctors’ fees as well. This is the charge for two doctors to sign the Medical Certificates for Cremation.
